In late 1995, Judie and Ken Kesson (then Bajamar residents) visited the Chili Cook Off in Ensenada. There was not only chili but great margaritas and small booths with items for sale. One of those booths had inexpensive costume jewelry which Judie perused and decided against, when one of the women there said "We know this isn't great jewelry, but the money we make goes to help Mexican girls stay in school." That grabbed the Kesson's attention having lived in Mexico for seven years believing that education was both mandatory and free. It was a shock to hear the required expenses for a student to stay in school…uniforms, "sports uniforms" if they wanted to participate in recess or sports, inscription payments in high school and no public transportation.

Judie had just accepted a consulting position in Romania, but said she would give them a \$100 check for their work. These gals were thrilled and said \$100 was a major donation for them and asked where the Kessons' lived. Imagine the shock when the woman in charge tore up the check and said, "We live in Punta Banda, you need to help someone close to where you live!" Judie explained that she was leaving the country for an indefinite period of time but they persisted and asked for a commitment that it would be done!



With limited Spanish skills and time flying, Judie & Ken visited nearby schools and stores in search of a young girl with good grades and in true financial need. And, they found one! Alicia, then 12, who wanted to be a doctor. She had loving parents and lived in an unfinished house. She also had all "10" grades. Alicia was it!

The Kessons felt they had done their job, but upon returning from Romania for an R&R six months later, a neighbor of Alicia's knocked on the door saying her children could not return to school because they had NO shoes. Of course they were given money to buy shoes and asked to return the change. And, thus began the "SHOE BOX."

Months went by and word spread. It wasn't unusual for the Kessons to return and find a note under their door from someone in need. Judie started taking the Shoe Box around the neighborhood and asking people for \$5! (Obviously, this would never have been an approved "Business Plan!)

The contents of the Shoe Box grew and so did the requests for help. A few fine neighbors and friends became a loose committee, including current Director Cristina Imana.



Then life changed when another new neighbor asked if we had a 501C 3 as her company would match her donation if we did! The Tax Exempt Status was granted and life changed. The new organization now had a genuine Board of Directors, a Mission Statement, Application Forms and Rules. At the time there were seven students being supported with their uniforms, inscription fees and sometimes additional expenses. The first name chosen for the organization was Bajamar Scholarship Program and then when the Kessons moved north and the student base grew, the name was changed to Baja Scholarship Foundation or BSF.

The years flew by with valuable input from Board members and others supportive in the greater community. Sponsorships began to happen (sorry, not for \$5!) and though the Shoe Box was taken to groups asking for help, it was no longer the bank.

It was finally agreed that BSF's requirements were simple: (1) The student must have demonstrated excellent academic performance and attendance; (2) The family must definitely be in need; (3) High moral standards must be maintained, and; (4) Student grades must be reported at the end of each semester and continue to show an 8.0 average or higher.



Keeping track of students and keeping abreast of monthly payments to schools and institutions, even more than finances, have dictated how many students the BSF can handle. Sponsorships pay for about half of the average student's expenses. The balance to cover expenses must be raised through creative and regular fundraising events. The past 18 months have been extremely difficult for all charitable organizations, but BSF has had fabulous support in the community at large. Susanne Stehr, of Susanna's Restaurant, is a perfect example, sponsoring frequent Wine Pairing Luncheons that benefit the Foundation.

So, just how "magic" was that worn out Shoe Box? BSF has graduated five Registered Nurses, 3 Teachers, 2 Architects, a half dozen Engineers, a Chef, several Accountants, a Communications expert, several Business Managers, a Dentist and More. There are currently more than a dozen university students studying to meet their career goals. And, yes Alicia did become a doctor!

Although my father somewhat disagrees with my decision I understand, even though I won't be going into an infantry job, I chose to go into an air support job. Helicopter stuff.




A Sponsor/Student Story… (Continued)

COMPLIMENTS FOR A BSF STUDENT



This technique was born in the Aztec civilization and uses natural broom grass and beeswax mixed with tree resin to create beautiful pieces of art. One of his students, Agustin, a BSF student attending UABC, is learning the straw art technique. This technique requires patience and doing meticulous work. Eddgar said, "I am proud of Agustin's work; he is a very responsible and gentle student. He has gone from doing small pieces, like butterflies of 8x10 inches to bigger pieces of 12x16 inches. Currently, I am teaching him to learn the technical aspects of using the straw, without losing his own style. Since he started practicing with me, I realize that he has artistic skills that go together with his university goal of being an architect. He has a natural talent that makes him stand out."

"Agustin is becoming a good artist, and in the near future will be an architect with a broad vision of art." Art has always been a fundamental value in the aesthetics of architecture and Eddgar is happy to support Agustin perfect this skill that will help him in the future. 




